CHARACTERISTICS OF GEM

GEM has been positioned as a market designed to accommodate companies to which a higher investment risk may be attached than other companies listed on the Stock Exchange. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with the information regarding the ordinary resolutions to be proposed at the AGM relating to (i) the granting of the general mandates to issue and repurchase Shares; and (ii) the re-election of Directors.

A notice convening the AGM setting out the details of the ordinary resolutions to be proposed at the AGM is set out on pages 13 to 17 of this circular.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SHARES

At the last annual general meeting of the Company held on 2 August 2013, the Directors were granted a general mandate to allot, issue and otherwise deal with Shares and a general mandate to purchase Shares on the Stock Exchange. These mandates will expire at the conclusion of the AGM. At the AGM, among other businesses, ordinary resolutions will be proposed to grant the Share Issue Mandate, the Repurchase Mandate and the Extension Mandate to the Directors.

The maximum number of Shares to be issued, allotted and otherwise dealt with pursuant to the Share Issue Mandate shall not exceed 20% of the Shares in issue at the date of passing of the ordinary resolution numbered 6 in the notice of AGM.

The maximum number of Shares to be repurchased pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate shall not exceed 10% of the Shares in issue at the date of passing of the ordinary resolution numbered 7 in the notice of AGM.

Each of the Share Issue Mandate, the Repurchase Mandate and the Extension Mandate will continue to be in force until the earliest of (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company following the AGM; or (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Articles or any applicable law of the Cayman Islands to be held; or (iii) the date on which such authority is revoked or varied by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in a general meeting of the Company.

Under Rule 13.08 of the GEM Listing Rules, the Company is required to give to the Shareholders an explanatory statement containing all the information reasonably necessary to enable them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the ordinary resolution to grant to the Directors of the Repurchase Mandate. The explanatory statement required by the GEM Listing Rules is set out in Appendix I to this circular.

RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the Board consists of six Directors, namely, Ms. Ng Mui King, Joky, Mr. Tong Wang Shun, Ms. Zeng Jieping, Mr. Chung Koon Yan, Mr. Chan Ying Cheong and Mr. Lau Ching Wai, Peter.

In accordance with Article 117 of the Articles, Mr. Tong Wang Shun will retire by rotation and he will offer himself for re-election at the AGM.

Mr. Lau Ching Wai, Peter ("Mr. Lau") has been appointed by the Board as independent non-executive Director with effect from 30 September 2013. Pursuant to Article 100 of the Articles, Mr. Lau shall hold office until the AGM and shall then be eligible for re-election at the AGM. Mr. Lau has confirmed that he will offer himself for re-election at the AGM.

Particulars of the Directors proposed for re-election at the AGM are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Set out on pages 13 to 17 of this circular is a notice convening the AGM at which, among other matters, ordinary resolutions will be proposed to grant the Share Issue Mandate, the Repurchase Mandate and the Extension Mandate to the Directors and to re-elect Directors.

In accordance with Rule 17.47(4) of the GEM Listing Rules, all votes of Shareholders at the AGM will be taken by poll. An announcement of the results of the poll will be published after the AGM in accordance with the requirements of the GEM Listing Rules.

A form of proxy for use at the AGM is enclosed with this circular. Whether or not you are able to attend the AGM, you are requested to complete and return the enclosed form of proxy in accordance with the instructions printed thereon to the Hong Kong branch share registrar and transfer office of the Company, Hong Kong Registrars Limited, at 17M/F, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Wanchai, Hong Kong, as soon as possible but in any event not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for the holding of the AGM or any adjourned meeting thereof. Completion and return of the form of proxy will not preclude you from attending and voting in person at the AGM or any adjournment thereof, should you so wish and in such event the form of proxy shall be deemed to be revoked.

RECOMMENDATION

The Directors consider that the proposed grant of the Share Issue Mandate, the Repurchase Mandate and the Extension Mandate, and the proposed re-election of Directors are in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole and recommend the Shareholders to vote in favour of the relevant resolutions set out in the notice of AGM.

RESPONSIBILITY STATEMENT

This circular, for which the Directors collectively and individually accept full responsibility, includes particulars given in compliance with the GEM Listing Rules for the purpose of giving information with regard to the Company. The Directors, having made all reasonable enquiries, confirm that to the best of their knowledge and belief the information contained in this circular is accurate and complete in all material respects and not misleading or deceptive, and there are no other matters the omission of which would make any statement herein or this circular misleading.

This appendix contains the particulars that are required by the GEM Listing Rules to be included in an explanatory statement to enable the Shareholders to make an informed decision whether to vote for or against the resolution to be proposed at the AGM in relation to the Repurchase Mandate.

1. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the authorised share capital of the Company was HK\$200,000,000 comprising 2,000,000,000 Shares, of which 1,127,628,000 Shares are in issue.

Under the Repurchase Mandate, the number of Shares that the Company may repurchase shall not exceed 10% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the date of passing the relevant resolution at the AGM.

Subject to the passing of the relevant ordinary resolution to approve the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased between the Latest Practicable Date and the date of the AGM, the Company would be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 112,762,800 Shares during the period from the date of passing the relevant ordinary resolution up to the earliest of (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company following the AGM; (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Articles or any applicable law of the Cayman Islands to be held; and (iii) the date on which such authority is revoked or varied by an ordinary resolution of Shareholders in a general meeting of the Company.

2. REASONS FOR THE REPURCHASE

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders to have a general authority from the Shareholders to enable the Directors to repurchase Shares on the market. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net assets of the Company and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchases will benefit the Company and the Shareholders as a whole.

3. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, any repurchase will be made out of funds which are legally available for the purpose in accordance with the Articles, the GEM Listing Rules and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands.

As compared with the financial position of the Company as at 31 March 2014 (being the date to which the latest audited consolidated financial statements of the Group were made up), the Directors consider that there might be a material adverse impact on the working capital and/or the gearing position of the Company in the event that the Repurchase Mandate were to be exercised in full. However, the Directors do not intend to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital or the gearing position of the Company.

4. UNDERTAKING OF DIRECTORS

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange to exercise the power of the Company to make repurchases pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the GEM Listing Rules and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands.

5. EFFECT OF THE TAKEOVERS CODE

If a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases on the Company exercising its powers to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of the Takeovers Code issued by the Securities and Futures Commission of Hong Kong. As a result, a Shareholder or a group of Shareholders acting in concert, depending on the level of increase of the Shareholders' interest, may obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, according to the register of members kept by the Company and so far as is known to, or can be ascertained after reasonable enquiry by the Directors, the shareholding interests of the substantial Shareholders (as defined in the GEM Listing Rules) were as follows:

- Pursuant to the SFO, Fine Day Asset Holdings Inc. is deemed to be interested in this shareholding interest through Gold City Assets Holding Ltd., which is a company owned as to 51% by Ms. Ng Mui King, Joky and as to 49% by Fine Day Asset Holdings Inc. Ms. Ng Mui King, Joky is an Executive Director of the Company and is also a director of Gold City Assets Holdings Ltd. Ms. Yang Cheng is 100% beneficial owner of Fine Day Asset Holdings Inc.
- Mr. Tong Wang Chow ("Mr. Tong") is deemed to be interested in this shareholding interest of which 72,904,000 Shares (approximately 6.47% of the issued share capital of the Company) are held by Mr. Tong and 5,000,000 Shares (approximately 0.44% of the issued share capital of the Company) are held by Mr. Tong's spouse.
- Apart from the 155,000,000 Shares issued by the Company to Mr. Huang Shih Tsai ("Mr. Huang") as partial consideration for the acquisition of 100% equity interest in a company wholly-owned by Mr. Huang (the "Transaction"), Mr. Huang is interested in 169,200,000 Shares relating to derivative interests in a convertible note issued by the Company to Mr. Huang as partial consideration for the Transaction.

Assuming that there would not be any change in the issued share capital of the Company prior to the repurchase of Shares and that the above substantial Shareholders would not dispose of their Shares nor acquire additional Shares prior to any repurchase of Shares, if the Repurchase Mandate were exercised in full, the percentage of shareholding of the above substantial Shareholder would be increased as follows:

Such increase will give rise to an obligation on Gold City Assets Holdings Ltd. to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. However, the Directors have no present intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent so as to result in triggering takeover obligation or the public holding of Shares would be reduced below 25% of the issued share capital of the Company.

Save as aforesaid, the Directors are not aware of any consequence which would arise under the Takeovers Code as a consequence of any repurchases pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate.

6. DIRECTORS, THEIR ASSOCIATES AND CONNECTED PERSONS

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge and belief, having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their respective associates, have any present intention, in the event that the proposed Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders, to sell any of the Shares to the Company.

No connected person of the Company has notified the Company that he/she/it has a present intention to sell any of the Shares to the Company nor has he/she/it undertaken not to sell any of the Shares held by him/her/it to the Company in the event that the Company is authorised to make repurchase of Shares.

7. SHARE REPURCHASE MADE BY THE COMPANY

No repurchase of Shares has been made by the Company (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise) during the six months preceding the Latest Practicable Date.

Mr. Tong Wang Shun

Mr. Tong Wang Shun (“Mr. Tong”), age 72, has been an executive Director since 4 December 2009. Mr. Tong has over 31 years of experience in shipping, property investment and corporate management.

Pursuant to a service agreement with the Company dated 3 November 2012, Mr. Tong’s appointment as an executive Director is fixed for a term of two years commencing on 4 November 2012. The director’s fee of Mr. Tong is HK\$240,000 per annum with a fixed sum annual bonus equal to HK\$20,000 and a discretionary bonus as may be determined by the Company with reference to the audited consolidated net profit of the Group attributable to Shareholders. Mr. Tong is also entitled to share option as may be granted by the Company. Mr. Tong’s service agreement has been approved by the remuneration committee of the Company.

Save as disclosed in this circular and as at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Tong does not have any other relationship with any director, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholder of the Company or has any interest in the Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Tong does not hold any position with other members of the Group save and except his directorship in Telecom Develop Limited, a wholly-owned subsidiary of the Company.

Save as disclosed above and as at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Tong does not hold any directorships in the last three years in public companies, the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas.

Mr. Tong is not aware of other information that is required to be disclosed pursuant to Rule 17.50(2)(h) to (v) of the GEM Listing Rules or any other matters that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders in relation to the proposed re-election of him as an executive Director.

Mr. Lau Ching Wai, Peter

Mr. Lau Ching Wai, Peter (“Mr. Lau”), aged 37, holds a Bachelor of Science (Information System) degree from the University of New South Wales. He has over 13 years of experience in printing, finance and corporate management.

Pursuant to an appointment letter of the Company dated 30 September 2013, Mr. Lau’s appointment as an independent non-executive Director is fixed for a term of one year commencing on 30 September 2013. The director’s fee of Mr. Lau is HK\$10,000 per month. Mr. Lau is also entitled to share option as may be granted by the Company. Mr. Lau’s remuneration is determined by the remuneration committee of the Company.

Save as disclosed in this circular and as at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Lau does not have any other relationship with any director, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholder of the Company or has any interest in the Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO. “**Rights Issue**” means an offer of shares in the Company, or offer or issue of warrants, options or other securities giving rights to subscribe for shares in the Company open for a period fixed by the Directors to shareholders of the Company whose names appear on the register of members of the Company on a fixed record date in proportion to their then holdings of shares in the Company (subject to such exclusions or

other arrangements as the Directors may deem necessary or expedient in relation to fractional entitlements or having regard to any restrictions or obligations under the laws of any relevant jurisdiction, or the requirements of any recognised regulatory body or any stock exchange in any territory applicable to the Company).”

7. “**THAT:**
